Survivor Pool Rules & Format

I MAKING PICKS

- A. All NFL picks are made "straight up" without using "point spreads".
- B. Entries must be completed on time. Once a game is locked, you may not change your pick for it. If you did not make a pick for a particular game or week, it is counted as a loss. There is NO "default pick".
- C. Players must select a "road" team in week 4, week 8, and week 12 with pick #1. Pick #2 (if a player has one) may be placed on any team (Home or Away).
- D. A tie game results in a loss for both teams.

II PICK DEADLINES / SELECTIONS

- A. Regular Season Games: Any games played prior to Sunday will be locked at the start of the individual game. All remaining games (including the Monday Night Game) are locked at the scheduled start time of the <u>first</u> Sunday game.
- B. **Playoff Games:** Wild Card and Divisional Round games will lock at the start of the first game on each Saturday. Conference Round games will lock at the start of the first game. The Super Bowl deadline is prior to game time. Our countdown clock is the **only** official timing device.
- C. Selections: Each player is responsible for properly submitting a pick! You should always double-check your "My Picks" screen and/or "Players Picks" table to ensure that your pick was properly recorded. You should also receive an email response notifying you that 1) your pick was properly made or deleted on XXX (named) team, or 2) your pick was not properly recorded and you must pick again prior to any deadlines. We strongly suggest that you READ and SAVE these emails. Never wait until minutes before the deadline to make your pick because if an error occurs, you may not have time to submit another pick so your pick will be recorded as "No Pick". IT IS COMPLETELY YOUR RESPONSIBILITY.

III ENDING THE GAME

- A. If everyone loses their pick(s) prior to the Super Bowl except 1 player, the game is obviously over and we have a winner.
- B. If there are 21 or more players remaining, and all picks are lost in a single week, all picks are restored and we continue to the next week as if all were won. If 20 or fewer players remain and all picks are lost in a single week, the game is over and the pool is divided equally among the remaining players.
- C. Finally, if the player pool is reduced to ten (10) or fewer players, they will be provided 2 options to consider. The choice MUST be unanimous or we default to OPTION 1.
 - 1. OPTION 1: Continue playing until there is a clear winner or winners.
 - 2. OPTION 2: Split a portion of the pot (determined by the Commissioner) and continue playing until there is a clear winner or winners for the remaining prize.
- D. All payouts will occur immediately after the Super Bowl to coincide with the ending of the Replay game and all Super Bowl Boards.
